Intake appointments and initial evaluations are conducted by nurses. Therapy and special instruction are offered in home or childcare settings. Toddler groups are also available. <p>South King Early Intervention Program (SKIP) provides home and community based early intervention services for eligible children ages birth to three. At SKIP every family is paired with a Family Resources Coordinator (FRC) and service provider(s) from a team that includes Speech Therapists, Physical Therapists, Occupational Therapists, and Early Education Teachers. Together with the family, we create an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) that addresses each family’s unique concerns, as well as their hopes and dreams. Along with direct therapy and education services, SKIP providers coach families and caregivers on how to recognize learning opportunities which occur during typical family routines. Services are provided in the child’s home, daycare, and other community settings.
